

- Thank your judge, group, tracklayer, helpers, secretaries, volunteers, etc. for their hard work
- Listen to the critique standing up, with a controlled dog in a sit or down
- Treat them with respect and be professional
- Don't put the judge up at a bug infested hotel and feed them days old pizza
- Don't expect high scores earn them!
- If you disagree/question a score or evaluation, wait until a break and professionally discuss with the judge. They will be more than willing to explain their rating.
- Expect a fair, consistent, and honest evaluation

Director of Judges' Message

t has been an unprecedented year in our lives due to the COVID-19 pandemic changing all of our lives forever.

Dog Sport worldwide has been affected just as almost everything else has — training, trials, shows, breed surveys, National and World Championships, Sieger Shows — all cancelled for 2020.

But we are starting up again and there have already been trials held and more scheduled by the time of this publishing. USCA is still, at this time, hoping to be able to hold our 2020 USCA GSD National Championship in November and we are looking at opening up and making the entry requirements much easier for this year only due to the lack of trials and that some Regional Championships that were not held. So keep an eye out for further announcements regarding the 2020 Nationals and, if it is held, the waiver or changes of requirements to enter to help our membership be able to compete in the event.

With COVID-19 still very much a part of our lives nationwide USCA has approved guidelines for holding trials for our members' safety. They are published in this issue. It is important for all members to review and follow them. Also keep in mind when scheduling judges that there are some states that have mandatory 14-day quarantines in place for anyone entering the state. This may affect your judges' ability to travel and judge at your trial. USCA Judges are not allowed to overlook any of these state or CDC requirements/restrictions. So if it stops your judge from being able to travel to your event we will make every effort to get you a judge from an area that can travel to your event. It is also important to remember that clubs that

request a USCA Judge and confirm the travel for that judge are responsible for any and all costs involved unless it is the judges' decision to cancel. As an example, if a club schedules a trial and makes travel arrangements (airline tickets, etc.) and something changes that does not allow the judge to come to the event that is not the judges' decision, the host club is still responsible for any reimbursement of prepaid travel costs. I would suggest all clubs and judges get refundable tickets at this point in time to help protect you from any losses in cancelling events.

I have added additional clarifications (these are not new "rules" but are the decisions and clarifications of how to evaluate the IGP made by the SV) on the IGP rules that were approved by the SV/VDH and apply to USCA Trials on the FAQ section of the USCA website. As examples, they explain the requirements to wait for the judge to signal the start of an exercise — starting without the judges signal is faulty; a dumbbell throw that is at an angle to one side or the other is not allowed to be rethrown any longer; re-throws will be requested by the judge for short or exceptionally long throws only; all points are lost in IGP1 "recall over the wall" if the dog does not scale the wall; all points are lost for the dog not presenting the dumbbell to the handler; the "send out with down" for a dog that goes to the end of the field or returns to handler; and other criteria for some of the exercises. Please check the website from time to time so that you may have the best information available to properly show your dog in a trial. If you are unsure, take the time at the handler's meeting at the start of a trial to ask questions.

Best of luck with your training and trialing. Stay safe and healthy.

National Breed Warden's Message

SV Breed Survey one year extension information.

The SV has told USCA that the USCA office must be the ones to file for extension with them on behalf of dog owner(s). USCA may only file for extension for SV Breed Surveys done within our organization. Jody Donaldson will assist USCA members by

alerting the SV of dogs our members have imported to the US that had a SV Breed Survey done in Germany that are due for lifetime before 12/31/20.

Following is a list of all breed surveys done at USCA events that are due for lifetimes this year. If you are an owner on this list, please forward your original pedigree(s) to Jody at the USCA office for her to stamp the one year breed surveys extension on your pedigree(s). *This must be done before* 12/31/20.

If you are a USCA member and have imported a dog with a SV Breed Survey done <u>only</u> in Germany that is due for lifetime this year, please contact Jody with the name of the dog. She will make another list for imported dogs. We will ask the SV if Jody needs to mail your original pedigree to them to stamp or if they will allow her to stamp it. We are not sure about that scenario yet. If you did your first time breed survey at a GSDCA event, you must contact GSDCA for their process. We cannot file the extension for you, they must do this.

If you have done a SV Breed Survey at a USCA event that you believe should be on this list and is not, please contact Jody at USCA office. If you have any questions, please let me know.

Dear All:

We trust that you are all at good health.

If the regular schedule had allowed for it the WUSV Universal Championship 2020 would have come to an end last weekend.

Notwithstanding the postponement of the event, our friends at the Club du Chien de Berger Allemand (CCBA) in France are busy working on the preparations of the event that shall now be held from November 25th, to November 29th, 2020.

In order to obtain a general overview and for the sake of a higher level of planning reliability, we are permitting ourselves to already request whether your club intends to send a team to participate in the event. Please kindly inform the WUSV Secretariat General accordingly by July 04th, 2020 at the latest.

We would like to use this opportunity to point out that the selection procedure is clearly subject to the sovereignty of the individual member countries. Caused by the various restrictions imposed in terms of the Corona pandemic some countries might face problems to carry out the qualification trials respectively to cope with the particular requirements. We strongly recommend that those in charge of these issues in the individual member countries let common sense prevail over special national criteria in this very special situation.

Thank you very much for your support in this matter. Your early response will be highly appreciated.

3. General examination regulations and registration

The WUSV Universal Championship consists of a combination evaluation: A) Trial (subject to the current examination regulations of the WUSV/ IGP at level 3. B) Health Issues (HD and ED evaluation as recognized by the SV) C) Anatomy (breed show according to the requirements of the GHKL – Working Dog Class). Only dogs can be admitted to the event who were selected in this respect by their national clubs (LAO) and who previously successfully passed an examination based on the WUSV/ IGP 3 including a trial title, who have obtained a breeding evaluation GOOD at the minimum age of twelve months, and with a HD/ ED diagnostic (normal, almost normal or still admitted as recognized by the SV) entered into their pedigree. For the team competition a maximum of 6 participants plus one substitute per national organization can be registered. The winner teams (male & female) of the previous year directly qualify for the WUSV Universal Championship and can be registered in addition to their national team. Every dog handler may only lead one dog. The WUSV Board of Directors can grant additional authorization to start in individual cases.

In order to comply with the formal requirements in this respect the pedigree and the certificate of the first breed survey need to be submitted in case that such a prolongation is desired. A prolongation until December 31st, 2021 will then be entered into the pedigree and into the certificate of the first breed survey.

If you handle this in the same fashion with regard to breed surveys that were held in your country we will, of course, accept this procedure as well. In order to file the prolongations in our documents it would suffice if you sent us a list of the names of the dogs who were allowed to benefit from the respective prolongation.

Furthermore, we kindly request a copy respectively a sample of the entry of the breed survey data into the pedigree and breed survey certificate as handled by your organization. Please find attached an example of the entries as handled by the SV for your convenience.

Also, please be informed that it is of relevance to us to know in which country the first breed survey was carried out. The respective club in the country concerned can also approve of the breed survey prolongation period and provide for the entries required in this respect. It is – however – irrelevant whether the owner of the dog in question maintains his or her place of residence in another country.

If – for instance – the first breed survey of a dog was carried out in Germany and the animal was later on sold abroad, the prolongation for the breed survey deadline needs to be applied for at the SV and not at the club in the country in which the new owner lives.

In case you do not wish to implement the procedure as outlined above within your organization, please kindly keep us informed. We are looking forward to hearing from you again and in case of doubt please do not he sitate to contact us.

It was fall, and I was four-yearsold sitting on my favorite blanket that my mom laid out for me under my favorite tree. I sat in awe and watched my angelic mom, as I typically did, training her black and tan German Shepherd [Dog], Quinn. I watched in amazement as my mom effortlessly

commanded Quinn to complete tasks. As a young girl, I was so curious and yearned to do the same, just like my mom. I will never forget the day my mom told me to stand next to Quinn. I had a youthful enthusiasm that could not be contained. I was finally going to walk in my mom's footsteps. This is one of the most memorable moments of my life; it helped shape my future.

Schutzhund is a test developed to emphasize the working temperament and abilities in German Shepherd [Dogs]. There are three phases, which includes their obedience and willingness to protect. Quinn, had successfully passed all of the tests. I eagerly wanted to be just as good at training dogs as my mom. I began with the word, "fose", which meant walk next to me and give me your full attention. I glanced at my mom for approval, and her smile embraced my heart.

I eagerly awoke early every Sunday from that day on to work with my mom and Quinn. After a few months, my mom confidently placed me in my first dog show. In a world dominated by adults, many were surprised to see a five-year-old handling a dog. I made history that day as the youngest person to compete in a show. The SV magazine in Germany placed me on their front cover, and the sport magazine in the USA had an article about me. All of this was happening because my mom's confidence in my abilities.

After that first competition, my mom gifted me my first dog, Hessy. Hessy, my mom, and I worked tirelessly, and after months of training, I competed in my first regionals, where I again dropped the jaws of all the spectators due to my age. After each phase, I would sit in the grass lying next to Hessy, while the judges convened to complete scoring. I did not care what we scored; I just laid with my best friend and my mom. My mom's smile demonstrated how proud she was of me, and that is all that mattered to me.

Before I knew it, I was going to the USCA Nationals, where I would have to compete against adults from all over the nation. It was early October, there was no sun peeking out through the overcast; we sat outside the gate waiting to checkin. I was definitely



nervous but knew this was my calling, and we were ready. I was and am the first and only seven-year-old to complete in a national event.

Sharing my first few years of dog training with my mom is my treasured memory and helped shape my future. A year after I set the record as the youngest person to compete in a national event, my mom passed away due to Breast Cancer. I hold the time we spent together tightly in my heart and know every time I am training or competing, she is smiling down at me with that same prideful smile she once showed me that fall day many years ago. I watched her in admiration as she trained and in many other aspects of life, a determined girl and longed to follow in her footsteps. I broke barriers down and set historic records in dog competitions, all because my mom believed in me. I continue breeding, training, and competing dogs to this day all because that one fall day when I was four-years-old sitting on my favorite blanket that my mom laid out for me under my favorite tree.

Why No Single Food Works for Every Dog

As dog people, you probably hear it at shows, online, in the field and at training. If someone is not asking about the best dog food, they are telling you which is the best dog food. It could be a name brand dry food or it could be a raw feeding regimen that someone is touting. It does not really matter unless you factor in the most important aspect of the conversation, the dog.

Every Dog Is Different

While some foods and feeding programs are better than others, it is really difficult to arrive at the best options without taking the specific dog, or dogs, into account. Just like people have different activities, sensitivities and metabolism, so do dogs. Even dogs from the same genetic lines, and even from the same litters, can be very different in how the grow, develop, act, work and play. I will say it again since it is so important to remember. Every dog is different.

A great example of this is something I frequently reference in my own situation. I have two females from the same litter. While they are hunting dogs rather than working dogs, the example still holds true. Despite the fact that they are from the exact same genetic lines, are the same age, the same sex and virtually the same size, they are very different in a number of ways. Here are a few examples.

Build: Although there is only about three pounds weight difference, one is more compact, lean and muscular while the other has a long profile with softer

body cover. Surprisingly, while they are both very fit and agile dogs, the softer looking one is the more athletic of the two.

Energy Level: The more compact muscular dog is much more energetic in nearly all aspects. The dog that is longer and a bit softer in appearance is much calmer in general.

Personality: While both are very people and dog friendly, one is apt to follow you everywhere you go and always wants to be near you. She is the ultimate people pleaser. The other, while very affectionate, requires less frequent close contact and prefers to do it on her terms. She is often paying more attention to her own program. Even their demeanor is obviously different as you can see in the photo we have included with the article.

Feeding and Management: While they can both be fed the same diet, the smaller, more active one will tend to lose weight if not fed more. She also tends to be more heat sensitive and requires more careful hydration during activity. The other just seems to need less food and water to produce the same level of work despite being slightly larger. She also tends to handle heat better and pant less.

Feeding Factors

Due to the nature of our business as a dog food company, we are often asked which of our formulas is the right one for their dog. After first stating that, you guessed it, every dog is different, we follow up with a few questions that help us determine the most likely starting point for a good match. Regardless of what you prefer for your feeding program, these are generally good indicators of what type of diet will work best for your dog.

- 1) How old is the dog?
- 2) How large will the dog be at maturity?
- 3) What are you currently feeding?
- 4) Approximately how much do you currently feed?
- 5) Does the dog lose weight easily?
- 6) How are the stools currently?
- 7) Does the dog have any known food sensitivities?

If we can get good answers to most, or all, of these questions, we can be pretty confident in providing a food recommendation with a high likelihood of success.

Selecting a Feeding Program

To determine your own best approach, it helps to recognize that each dog is a little different and pay close attention to the feeding factors we noted above. It also helps to focus your attention on products and programs that cater to the active working and sporting dog. We tend to have a high success rate with activity stressed dogs precisely because that is what our products are built to address. Feeding programs that are more genera-l or geared toward less active companion animals often struggle to meet these demands.





Suggested Best Practices for the Well-Being of Dog Sport Participants




USCA supports each club's informed decision to reschedule, postpone or cancel their events, as well as supporting clubs ready to hold events in locations that are open and permit gatherings. As events resume across the country, people need to feel safe while enjoying their dog activities. USCA urges clubs to take precautions for the benefit of their participants. Events need to be held in a manner that emphasizes the safety of participants and event staff over efficiency. Comply with federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and orders required in the jurisdiction of the venue.

The following is a list of suggested best practices that may be helpful when planning or attending an event. Event locations, facilities and dates will differ. With a situation that is continually evolving, it is up to the clubs to determine the guidelines that best fit their event. In order to inform participants, specific guidelines established by the club should be published on the club website and posted on signage/flyers at their event.

General Practices

 Clubs, officials, participants, and spectators are required to follow and comply with federal, state, local and facility guidelines that apply to the area and site where the event is held.



- 3. It is strongly recommended that everyone at the event practice social distancing and wear a mask or another face covering suitable for their circumstances even if not required by federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and orders in the jurisdiction of the venue in which the event will take place.
 - Bring your own masks or other face coverings, hand sanitizer, gloves and tissues. Hosting clubs might not provide these items. Or, they might not be available in sufficient quantities to supply everyone that wants or needs them.
- 4. Consider wearing disposable or washable gloves.
- 5. Have plenty of hand sanitizers placed for people to use (avoid placing in direct sunlight).
- 6. Wash hands as frequently as possible. Have disinfecting spray at bathroom facilities for people to spray door handles (or anything else they touch).
- 7. If you utilize portable toilets, please ask for a hand washing station to be delivered as well.

- 8. Avoid shaking hands or hugging.
- 9. Avoid touching dogs that are not your responsibility.
- 10. Avoid common use pens/pencils bring your
- 11. Disinfect surfaces in common use areas as often as possible (tables, chairs, doorknobs, etc.) Clubs and facilities may consider not providing chairs.
- 12. Meals No potlucks. Hospitality areas should avoid community items such as salt and pepper shakers, condiments, creamers, etc. It is recommended that club supply boxed lunches for judges and volunteers and a separate cooler for each judge. Participants should consider bringing their own lunch/drinks.
- 13. Parking areas park with sufficient distance between vehicles if possible.

Event Practices

- Scheduling Consider scheduling participants in blocks in order to reduce crowds.
 - Use SignUp Genius (free app) to schedule or the event secretary assigns dogs to a time block.
 - Set times for day-of-event entries assign day-of-event participants a time and number.
- 2. It is strongly recommended that participants practice social distancing and wear a mask or another face covering suitable for their circumstances even if not required by federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations, and orders in the jurisdiction of the venue in which the event will take place or the rules of the USCA or the SV/WUSV. Please bring your own masks as they may not be provided to participants and attendees by the hosting club(s).
- 3. Participants waiting to trial should practice social distancing. (Option: text or call when it is time for participant to come to the field).
- 4. Safe handling of paperwork and payment for day-of-event entries.
 - Go cashless as much as possible encourage use of PayPal, Google Pay,

- EWallet, etc.
- Cash for day-of-event entries inform participants they should have correct change.
- Individual handling paperwork, scorebooks, and entry fees should wear gloves.
- 5. Consider having someone wearing gloves handling out trophies and certificates.
- Trial Secretary Area Recommend that it is set up with a minimum of six feet between the Trial Secretary area and exhibitors. Judges Table – Judges should have a separate worktable that is not accessible to exhibitors.
- 7. During the trial, those in assisting with field duties should practice social distancing.
- 8. Equipment should be set up by a person wearing a mask and gloves. Equipment should not be touched by handlers, however, if a person touches the equipment, it should be sanitized.
- Identity checks will be performed but may be modified for COVID safety requirements and guidelines.
- 10. In all phases the handler will report in and out no closer than 6 feet from the judge.

Comply with all federal, state, local government, facility and event guidelines. Clubs should be prepared to enforce the guidelines that apply to their event.

Tracking:

- 1. IGP 2 and Higher The tracklayer should be the only person to handle the tracking flags and articles for each track, each day.
- 2. Day of the Trial: Ask trial participants to wait by their vehicles until the time of the draw. The draw for track order should be set up to allow for safe social distancing. Numbered draw items may be placed on the ground by the trial secretary in random order. The secretary may call each competitor up one at a time to designate the draw item. After the draw for track order, an event worker should be designated to control traffic for exhibitors and spectators. This will ensure each exhibitor will be able to park closest to their track and are able to maintain social distancing. The spectators should practice social distancing guidelines.
- 3. Articles: All tracklayers are advised to wear masks and gloves while handling the articles. Clubs are advised to provide unused and sealed articles for each track.
 - During the track, the tracklayer may wear a mask and gloves. Competitors should wear face covering and gloves during the track. After the dog has found the article, the handler shows the article to the judge and before the restart places the found article in a Ziplock (or similar) bag carried by the handler.

Obedience:

Before the trial begins if the handler has their own dumbbells (all levels) they may use them. Ensure they are marked with the handler's name and given to the trial secretary. If they do not have their own dumbbells the club must provide disinfected dumbbells. Club should have a designee responsible for wiping the dumbbells with sanitizing wipes after each separate handler has completed the retrieve exercises. The designee should wear gloves which are changed after each wipe down.

The group must maintain minimum distance of 12 feet from each other, and wear mask and/or face shield. Handler may stop in the middle of the group maintaining the 6 foot distance.

Protection:

- Both handler and helper must wear masks and gloves during the protection routine.
- After taking the stick from the helper, the side transport is performed normally.
- Handler reports out maintaining 6 feet distance away from the judge.
- The stick may be given back to the helper or lay it on the ground after reporting out.
- The stick will be sanitized, and the helper should change gloves after every dog.

Search & Rescue Workshop with Stephanie Dunion

On June 6 and 7, 2020, the High Desert Working Dogs club in Sierra Vista, Arizona, hosted USCA RH Director Stephanie Dunion to conduct a workshop on USCA's Search and Rescue program. Originally planned for March, when the temperatures would have been a bit cooler, fate stepped in when COVID-19 precautions kept many people sheltering at home, including Stephanie. Although our June weekend was a grueling two days, for dogs and humans alike, with the temperatures reaching the mid-90s in the hot, Arizona sun, with lots of cooling breaks, everyone pushed through and ended up learning a lot and having fun at the same time.

The hot weather was not the only obstacle to deal with that weekend. The flora of Southeast Arizona can best be described as prickly. Everything that grows here has stickers, from the prickly pear cactus and other cacti varieties, to the mesquite trees, to Cat's claw bushes, to a particularly nasty weed known as Goat's



head, or Tribulus terrestris. These tiny stickers can cause quite a bit of pain for a dog that has the misfortune to step on one. Fortunately, none of our dogs had a misstep that weekend.

The fauna in this part of Arizona can be just as treacherous, with the most worrisome creature being rattlesnakes. Most dogs, however, receive what is called snake avoidance training so they learn to avoid the sight, smell, and sound of these nasty reptiles.



Other animals to be on the lookout for include coyotes, javelinas [a pig-like animal with

sharp teeth that can do serious damage to any dog unfortunate enough to tangle with one, bobcats, and of course, rabbits. Happily, most of these animals are nocturnal and none were encountered over the course of the weekend.

Stephanie Dunion is the USCA's first official RH judge. She completed an approved apprenticeship and can award the RH 1 & 2 titles as well as the BH and AD at any USCA event. Because the RH program is growing, USCA believed it was important to be leading the effort for this new title and developing judges to meet those needs. Stephanie has also been the USCA SV liaison for more than 30-years and is the official translator for the IRO — International Rescue Dog Organization — based in Austria, as well as working with the SV to develop and implement their version of the RH as a sporting title. The RH1 is only a sport level for search and rescue work. It was designed to ensure the true working ability of German Shepherd Dogs in character, stamina, and temperament. It is a certification process and a powerful tool in maintaining a strong work ethic for all our dogs.

We had a diverse selection of dogs participating in the workshop. Although many of the dogs were German Shepherd Dogs, we also had a Blue Heeler, Australian Shepherd Dog, Dutch/German Shepherd Dog mix, and a Poodle/Golden Retriever mix. All the dogs showed the stamina and character necessary to compete for the RH1 title. The following handler/dog teams participated in the RH training:

On-leash heeling with gunshots: the heeling pattern for this exercise is the same as all the other USCA IGP heeling patterns

Down with recall: out-of-motion as in the IGP routine

Group of people and dogs: although like the IGP group exercise, this one differs in that there is at least one handler/dog team in the group. In addition, the group does not stay in place but walks in a clockwise circle while the handler/dog team walk in a counterclockwise pattern



Down under distraction: same as in the IGP routine

Carry and handover: after the handler sends the dog to a table, the handler then physically picks up the dog, walks 10 paces and hands the dog over to another person who then sets the dog on the ground

Tunnel with sash: this is a 10-12-foot-long tunnel approximately 12 feet long, 12 inches wide, and 18-20 high. A 10-foot long sash attaches to one end and the dog must run through it with confidence



Crossing unpleasant material (or the rubble pile): the handler and dog must traverse this 3 x 3-meter area back and forth without hesitation. The dog also must demonstrate a sit in the rubble prior to leaving the site

Change of position: in this exercise the dog is sent to a 1 x 1-meter table 60 cm high. The handler, who is 10 paces away, then directs the dog to sit, down, and stand. After the "stand" command, the dog is recalled and placed in the basic position



Crossing a fixed wooden bridge without ramp: this bridge is about 12 feet long, 12 inches wide, and 18-20 inches off the ground

THIS CONFERENCE IS FOR ALL POLICE & MILITARY WORKING DOG HANDLERS & K-9 TRAINERS



We began early Saturday morning, but the temperatures were rising fast. To loosen up both the dogs and their handlers, we moved to the grass area on the training field and began with the group exercise. In this exercise, the dog/handler team must walk around the group of four people, two of whom have their dogs, complete a figure-8, and come to a stop next to a dog/handler team in the group. To complicate this exercise, the group is moving in one direction while the handler/dog team in walking in the opposite

direction. Stephanie directed traffic and prevented any confusion in which way everyone had to walk. Although a few handlers were a little apprehensive about doing the group exercise with their dogs, the dogs proved smarter and had no problems.

Next came the tunnel exercise. Because many of the dogs were unfamiliar with this obstacle, they had to be lured and coaxed until they were comfortable running through it. Since we were just beginning to teach this exercise, we did not attach the sash which would be required for an actual event. When each dog is familiar enough with the concept the sash will be attached, and we can practice running the dogs through it.

The fixed wooden bridge can be a little scary to some dogs, maybe because it has no sides and there is a slight gap between the two boards making up the length of this obstacle. Any dog working this obstacle should be aware of its body, particularly its hind end, in order to maintain its balance on the bridge. They are required to jump on top of the bridge and come to a halt at a verbal command from the handler. Upon the "go ahead" from the judge, the handler walks to the dog's side and instructs the dog to continue walking the bridge, jump off, and come to the basic position.

Following a barbecue to cap off a hard-working Saturday, the group gathered inside to watch an IRO promotional film detailing the exercises for the USCA




Search and Rescue II. Although it featured more advanced exercises, Stephanie carefully explained the differences in the two levels of exercises. It was also good to see these exercises being done, and it turned out that the variances between RH1 and RH2 were not too rigorous. Subsequently, many participants were enthusiastic about not only competing for an RH1 title but continuing to the RH2.

Sunday morning began much too early for some of the handlers, with tracking at 6:00 am. Part one of the FCI RH 1 involves a handler laid track of about 400 paces with three articles and two turns. In most of Arizona this means tracking on dirt. If you are lucky it is a plowed field with very few sticker bushes, goat heads, or other pesky plants. The challenge of tracking in Arizona in June is not necessarily the heat, it is fire ants. These critters can seem to appear out of nowhere when there is food on the track. Fortunately for us, we started tracking early enough in the morning that it was a little cooler and we beat the ants to the punch. Even though the field had not been plowed recently and was over-grown with weeds, the weeds were mostly yellow wildflowers and the dogs did not seem to mind.

We also began initial search work with our dogs by teaching the dog to search in a particular direction. We did this by tossing a favorite toy into the prickly Arizona brush. This initial training will ultimately aid a dog in finding a victim. Following certification in the RH1, a dog can continue to the RH2 and possibly certify under a designated search and rescue

organization, such as FEMA. Stephanie explained the various levels of RH1 and RH2. The breakdown of levels is as follows:

- A = RH1 suitability test
- B = RH2 levels A & B
- C = A letter designation: standard for both RH1 & RH2
 - RH-F = tracking
 - RH-FL = area search
 - RH-T = rubble
 - RH-W = water
 - RH-L = avalanche
- D = Four alert types
 - Bark alert dog must bark continuously and remain with the victim
 - Bringsel braided just attached to collar. The dog takes it in his mouth at the victim then returns to the handler with the bringsel in mouth
 - Recall/Re-find or free indication dog locates victim and runs back and forth between victim to lead handler to victim
 - Scratching used in avalanche/rubble work. The dog will scratch or paw at the snow/rubble pile to indicate

We were somewhat limited in the types of searches for which we could train. The avalanche search was out, for obvious reasons—Arizona summer heat

does not allow for much snow. The water search was also problematic. Although there are over 110 lakes in Arizona, due to our dry climate many of these lakes are intermittent lakes and do not contain water for much of the year. Even though Cochise County, features several lakes, the closest one, Parker Lake, was too far to travel in the time we had available to us. Stephanie explained how to create a rubble pile, but we were running out of time. This left tracking and area searches. We had completed our tracking in the early morning, so this left the area search. Initial training for this exercise involves teaching the dog directionality. The dog must be able to follow the handler's instruction to search for the victim in a particular direction. The dog must also be taught how to indicate when the victim is found. For most

dogs in this workshop the type of alert was either a bark alert, which is very much like the bark and hold in protection, or a recall/re-find of the victim. It all depends on what the dog is comfortable with.

Stephanie made sure to keep an eye on all the dogs, checking for injuries, dehydration, or other problems. She also instructed the handlers on what to look for, including giving us copies of articles on how to deal with medical issues that could arise while training. Considering all the prickly plants, we were directed to pay close attention to our dogs' feet.

At the end of the training on Sunday, Stephanie, Suzanne, and Thom, Suzanne's husband, toured a little of SE Arizona. The first stop was Fairbank, a ghost town in Cochise County, next to the San Pedro River. First settled in 1881, Fairbank was the closest rail stop to nearby Tombstone, which made it an important location in the development of southeastern Arizona. The town was named for Chicago investor Nathaniel Kellogg Fairbank who partially financed the railroad and was the founder of the Grand Central Mining Company, which had an interest in the silver mines in Tombstone. Today Fairbank is located within the San Pedro Riparian National Conservation Area. The next stop was Tombstone — the town "too tough to die" and Boothill Graveyard. Tombstone is a historic city in Cochise County, and was founded by Ed Schiefflin. It was one of the last boom towns in the American frontier. At its height, the local silver mines produced \$40 to \$85 million in silver bullion. Tombstone is best known as the site of the gunfight at the O.K. Corral. Boothill Graveyard in Tombstone features the graves of Billy Clanton, Frank McLaury, and Tom McLaury — the three men who were killed during that gunfight.

Stephanie left us with this message:

"It was indeed a pleasure to work with the High Desert Working Dogs Club and I sincerely appreciate their kind invitation to allow me to share this absolutely interesting program with them and their dogs. I also enjoyed the tour, as our country offers so much diversification in our country's history.

"From my perspective, I see a good field of teams that will effectively pass their RH1 titles easily. Of course, it will take more intense work than what I could offer during a workshop, but I am convinced they will be a dedicated group that will work diligently to achieve their goals.

"I applaud them also for doing this in such a diversified climate and under some very difficult conditions – the heat alone makes for a trying situation, rattlesnakes are in every thought and stepping on goat heads is no fun either! It was particularly important to note that the dogs all worked through the intense heat and uncomfortable conditions and it looked to me that they motivated the people more than the other way around! They just kept at it.

The future holds a lot for this dedicated group, and it will be a pleasure to continue working with them!"

Background: Due to the COVID-19 issues in our country, severe lack of travel options, and SV judges not wanting to commit to travel, the BAC must vote to cancel the 2020 USCA National Show. Cancelling this show places our 2020 Universal Sieger/Siegerin titles and the 2021 USCA Universal Team selection in jeopardy. Because of this, the BAC needs to set a temporary selection process for 2021.

Primary, Temporary Selection Process for Universal Sieger/Siegerin titles and 2021 Universal Team:

In lieu of National Show working class entry and show rating, I am proposing for there to be a "Working Male Class" and a "Working Female Class" show, to be held in conjunction with the USCA GSD Nationals. These working classes will be judged by a USCA Conformation Judge to be determined and approved by the BAC at a later date. Dogs vying for the 2020 Universal Sieger/Siegerin titles and the 2021 Universal Team will need to enter the appropriate working class (male or female) and obtain a show rating of "G" or higher to be eligible. **Specifically to earn the Universal Sieger/Siegerin titles, the dogs must also enter the USCA GSD Nationals as outlined in the Universal Program.** Secondary, Temporary Selection Process for 2021 Universal Team (if there are no candidates from the above listed selection process or it is cancelled):

 Entry into a USCA Regional Conformation Show (from January 1, 2020 through April 30, 2021) will be accepted in lieu of the above working class entry. Dog must obtain a show rating of "G" or higher to be eligible.

After all facets of this original application are complete, the names of the new USCA Judge applicants will appear in two issues of Schutzhund USA. Anyone wishing to comment as to the character or qualifications of the new applicants may do so in writing to the Judges Committee Chairman, Nathaniel Roque. These written comments must be received no later than four weeks following the second publication of the new applicant's name.

The Apprentice Judges are those who have met all training requirements. Apprentice Judge Trainees are those who still have not met the training requirement of titling one dog through a SchH3, a second dog to a SchH1, as well as obtaining an FH on a dog trained by the candidate. The apprentice trainees are yet to fulfill all requirements of the program but are currently active in training a dog toward that goal. All of the requirements for the USCA Apprentice Judge Program can be obtained by contacting the USCA Director of Judges.
